TO THE QUALIFIED VOTERS OF PIKE COUNTY, GEORGIA:

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that on the 15th day of March, 2011, a special election will be held at the regular polling places in all the election districts of Pike County, Georgia (the "County") at which time there will be submitted to the qualfied voters of the County for their determination the question of whether a special sales and use tax of one percent shall be imposed on all sales and uses in the special district consisting of the County for a period of time not to exceed five (5) years, to raise an estimated \$5,400,000 for the purpose of funding the following projects for the County: (i) captial outlay project renovating the Pike County Courthouse; and (ii) captial outlay projects consisting of improvements to the roads, streets and bridges of the Pike County Road System; and (b) the payment of costs associated with the issuance of the general obligation debt hereinafter authorized and the payment of interest on such general obligation debt.

If imposition of the tax is approved by the voters, such vote shall also constitute approval of the issuance of general obligation debt of Pike County in the principal amount of not to exceed \$2,400,000 for the purpose of funding all of the projects for the county described above.

The general obligation debt, if so authorized, may be issued by the County in whole or in part and shall bear interest from the first day of the month during which the general obligation debt is to be incurred or from such other date as may be designated by the County prior to incuring the general obligation debt, at a rate or rates not to exceed 3.69% per annum, payable monthly on the fifteenth of each month commencing on September 15, 2011, the amount of principal to be paid each year during the life of such debt shall be as follows:

The principal and interest on the general obligation debt are expected to be paid from the proceeds of the sales and use tax and shall be payable in lawful money of the United States of America at a paying agent bank which will be designated by the Board of Commissioners of Pike County prior to the incurrence of the general obligation debt.

Any brochures, listings or other advertisements issued by Pike County or by any other person, firm, corporation or association with the knowledge and consent of Pike County, shall be deemed to be a statement of intention of Pike County concerning the use of the proceeds of the general obligation debt; and such statement of intention shall be binding on Pike County in the expenditure of any such general obligation debt or interest received from such funds which have been invested.

The County will not conduct any performance audit or performance review with respect to the General Obligation Debt as may be described in Section 36-82-100, Official Code of Georgia Annotated.
